Rainwater System Project

You will have seen the activity on the North-East side of the building, where a new rainwater handling system is being installed.

The purpose of this is to separate the collection of rainwater from each side of the building to reduce the risk of water entering the building during very heavy storm conditions.

The work will take around two weeks to complete which includes some building work alongside the steps up to the road on that side of the building. During this work, access will be limited to one side of the steps only, so please take care.

Main Access Doors

The proposed project to undertake work to improve the main building entrance has been approved by the Fire Service, so we will shortly be going out to tender. We needed to get permission from them as to whether or not that entrance should be considered as an emergency exit or not.

They have confirmed that the existing size and number of fire exits present in the building, without considering the main entrance, is more than adequate for our building, given the number of people likely to be present at any one time.
