Although Isabelle played well throughout, unfortunately she met with defeat in all four games to more experienced players. However the experience she has gained will be invaluable to her.

Paul Warrington, our other competitor fared somewhat better. His first game against Rhys Taylor resulted in a 6-6 draw. Further matches in the group stage saw a 21-0 win against Keelin Mullen (Desborough), 12-4 win against Minah Elsayed (Desborough) and a 10-6 win against Emma Muir (Desborough). Overall Paul finished in top spot in group A, and earned a place in the semi-final.

This is very different from the game that we are used to, although they use the same bowls, which surprised me. They also bring the last 64 qualifiers to the event, which means that when the fours are being played, there are lots & lots of players on the green.

Rink Booking

Last month I mentioned that we were planning to change the system of rink booking from the existing paper system to an electronic system, using a computer tablet located in the same position as the current book, by the Bar.

The work to create this has been completed by our regular software development designer, Barry Beeken, and will be installed within the next week or so.

The system is very easy to use and is similar to the system used at the Latham House surgery when booking in for an appointment, having a touch screen. The Bar Staff will all be trained in its use and will assist if required.

The benefit of the new system is that it is linked to the Bowls Management System, and the office staff can see when changes are made, thereby making it easier to follow-up any issues.

We recognise and understand that some members don't like change, but this system is really simple to use, so please just give it a try. You will however, need to have your membership number at hand when using the system, so that it knows who you are.

Club Coaches

I am pleased to report that all four of our sponsored Level 1 Coach Qualification applicants have successfully completed the training. So when they become official we will have 10 Level 1 coaches in the Club.

We also have a number of members preparing for their Level 2 coaching qualification, so the club will have excellent resources for the ongoing coaching of our members.

Our thanks must go to Peter Bailey for organising all of this, and by the way, we were able to obtain support funding from the Bowls Development Alliance towards the cost of undertaking this coaching training.

Those members who can recall the early days of the late eighties and early nineties, will remember the regular nightly joke telling sessions from Royce, who always seemed to have a ready supply of new jokes available, and kept us all suitably entertained.

Royce was also a formidable bowler, particularly outdoors, where he won the county singles championship in 1977. Tony Allcock had won it in 1976 and again in 1978, so it gives you some idea of the quality of players around at the time.

He also qualified for the EBA Singles when it was held at Mortlake before moving to Worthing, where he also went on to compete on a number of occasions.

He regularly played for the club competitively, and would always turn out in the Inter-league games.

His most recent success was in managing the Melton "Team Pork Pies" to the National Championship Title in the 2015 Fantastic Fives Competition, our first National Title.

Royce will be remembered for his humour as much as for his excellent bowling ability, and will be missed by many members in the club.
