INTERESTED IN COACHING?

The Club wishes to encourage its Members to apply to become qualified bowls coaches.

If you are interested in learning how to encourage people to take up bowls and help them to improve their performance – **THEN WE NEED YOU.**

The Club has a thriving Junior Section and every year the Club as a whole recruits about 70 new members. With your help and enthusiasm we cannot only keep membership fees down but we can contribute to helping many Members to improve their game and stay with us for longer.

There are two levels of Coaching that the Club wishes to support:

Level 1 – Any Club Member aged 15+ - this course takes 2 days to complete including completion of a portfolio and an assessment and includes:

- Introduction to the Roles and Responsibilities of the Level 1 Bowls Coaching Assistant and the role of a Participation Programme Facilitator
- Safeguarding and Protecting Children and Vulnerable adults
- Health, Safety, Accidents and emergencies
- Effective Communication, Coaching and Learning
- Planning and Evaluation Bowls Coaching sessions
- Coaching a Beginner
- Warm ups
- Working with the Jack
- Working with the bowl

- Introducing Basic shots
- Cool downs



Level 2 – Any Level 1 qualified Coach - The course takes 5 days to complete in total, followed by the completion of a portfolio and an assessment and includes:

- Roles and Responsibilities of a Coach
- Coaching and Learning
- Communication
- Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults
- Equality and Diversity in Coaching Bowls
- Sports Science including Bowls Ballistics
- Warm ups, cool downs and exercises to support Bowls
- Treatment and Management of Injury
- Diet and Nutrition
- Drugs in Bowls
- Venue Risk Assessment
- Coaching Session Plans
- Bowls Technical Information
- Types of Shot

- Decision Making, Communication and Tactical Activities.

The club is prepared to fund the provision of the necessary training course, so there is no cost to our members.

All Members are encouraged to register their interest, without commitment, and depending on the response, the Club may be able to hold the courses on site. So please contact Peter Bailey, Director & Coach to find out more and hopefully register your interest. We would be delighted to see some of our younger players taking up this opportunity, it could lead to a career in coaching

Forthcoming National Championship Finals

On Saturday 25th March the EIBA Finals begin for eight days, concluding on Saturday 1st April, and once again we need volunteer stewards to make the event a professional one.

This is a prestigious event which we have been proud to stage most years since 1989, and it is financially worthwhile to the club.

A list has been posted on the Reception Desk showing the times of the various sessions, inviting members to add their names. The role of Steward is not an onerous one, and full training will be provided if you have not done it before. Some of our newer members may well appreciate the opportunity to get a close look at how the best players in the country perform. Entry to the event is free to all full members of the club, provided you carry your membership card.

If you are able to undertake just a couple of sessions as a Steward, it would be a great help the club, and enable us to maintain our position as the favoured location for this event.

Following on from the EIBA event, Thursday 6th April see's the beginning of the English Short Mat Bowling Association National Championship Finals, which is a first for Melton. Unlike the EIBA Finals which involve the last sixteen in each competition, the ESM-BA Finals include the last 64, so this will be a very busy event.

The game is played on a mat which is laid on top of our bowling carpet, and the plan is to lay twenty-four mats down, twelve at the Bar end and twelve at the far end, across the width of our green.

Each discipline (Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours) will be played from 64 starters to a finish, on each of the four days of the event, which concludes on Sunday 9th April.

Again, unlike the EIBA Finals, we are required to provide very little in the way of support for this event, so whilst we *will* have a couple of Stewards on each session just for safety reasons on Fire Doors etc, it should be a very simple event for us.

I would encourage members to come down and watch this very different form of indoor bowls, as it can be very intense, and is a much quicker game overall. Entry is free.
